"THE PRESENCE OF GOD IN THE HOME OF MAN"

GENESIS 2:4–25 (FOCUS ON 2:15)

[15] The LORD God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to work it and keep it.

EZEKIEL 36:33-36

[33] Thus says the Lord GOD: On the day that I cleanse you from all your iniquities, I will cause the cities to be inhabited, and the waste places shall be rebuilt. [34] And the land that was desolate shall be tilled, instead of being the desolation that it was in the sight of all who passed by. [35] And they will say, 'This land that was desolate has become like the garden of Eden, and the waste and desolate and ruined cities are now fortified and inhabited.' [36] Then the nations that are left all around you shall know that I am the LORD; I have rebuilt the ruined places and replanted that which was desolate. I am the LORD; I have spoken, and I will do it.

MARK 10:45

[45] For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.

REVELATION 22:1-3

[1] Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb [2] through the middle of the street of the city; also, on either side of the river, the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit, yielding its fruit each month. The leaves of the tree were for the healing of the nations. [3] No longer will there be anything accursed, but the throne of God and of the Lamb will be in it, and his servants will worship him.

How do these verses reveal God's action? How do they point us to God's greatest act of sending Jesus to rescue us from our sins?

WHO ARE WE?

Based on these verses, who has God created us to be? What do they tell us about our identity?

WHAT DO WE DO?

What action does God call us to based on these verses? How should who God is, what God has done, and who we are (see above) shape the way we live?
